#### NOMINATIONS FOR THE COMMITTEE HAVE BEEN RECEIVED FROM THE FOLLOWING PEOPLE

#### 1. Jacqui Lees – Chairperson

I became interested in Reggio philosophy when I was teaching in the USA. When I returned to New Zealand, I began working at <u>Pakuranga Baptist</u> <u>Kindergarten</u> and began attending RE Provocations conferences and workshops with the teachers in my team. I was able to go on a study tour to Reggio Emilia in 2008 and we began working with greater intentionality to implement Reggio philosophy in our Centre. In 2016 I attended the in-depth study tour focused on Pedagogical dialogue and this have deepened my practice even **more**.
